Low taxes in Nevada have made Las Vegas the place to be for industrial and professional growth, as inventory or corporate taxes are levied.

The Assessor's office of Clark County determines the value of each parcel of land whether improved or unimproved. The value is multiplied by 35% to acquire the assessed value of property.

Property taxes are figured by multiplying the assessed value by the tax rate, which for the 2001-2002 tax year was on average \$3.25 per \$100 of assessed value.

To calculate the tax on your home, let's assume you have a home with a taxable value of \$100,000, located in the City of Las Vegas. The tax rate for 2001-02 in the City is \$3.2546 per hundred of assessed value. To determine the assessed value, multiply the taxable value of the home (\$100,000) by the assessment ratio (35%):

\$100,000 X .35 = \$35,000 assessed value
To calculate the tax, multiply the assessed value by the tax rate (\$3.2546 per hundred dollars of assessed value).

\$35,000 (assessed value) x .032546 (tax rate) = \$1,139 taxes for the 2001-02 fiscal year.

Sheriff's Card If you are working in the gaming industry, it is mandatory in the state of Nevada to have a Sheriff's Card. To obtain one you must be gainfully employed. Your employer will provide you with a referral for a three year issuance. For more information you may contact:

Health Cards This card is mandatory for any and all food/beverage handlers, tattoo artists, child and adult care attendants, or massage therapists. In order to obtain a Health Card, you must complete an application. All food handler applicants will receive a Hepatitis A vaccination. Applicants for child or adult care will also receive the vaccination as well as a skin test or x-ray for Tuberculosis. All applicants must attend a 1.5 hr class and movie within 30 of applying for a Health Card. A temporary card is issued until class completion. The card costs \$30 valid for 3 years. Items Needed for License & Registration Transfers

Your Valid, State-Issued Drivers License

This must contain your name and date of birth. If your license is expired, suspended or revoked, call to determine what you need to do.

Proof of Your Social Security Number

If your social security number is not printed on your drivers license, you will need to bring your social security card.

Nevada Liability Insurance Card

Out of state insurance is not acceptable. Make sure the name(s) on your insurance and registration match exactly.

Smog Check Certificate if Needed

Exemptions include vehicles based in rural areas, motorcycles, vehicles older than 1968, alternative fuel vehicles and new vehicles registered less than two years.

Your Current Registration Slip(s)

Nearly all trailers must be registered and titled.

Title(s), Unless Held By Lienholder

You have the option of retaining your out-of-state title. We strongly suggest getting a Nevada title if possible.

VIN Check(s)

Vehicle Identification Number inspections are done at DMV offices. In Las Vegas, drive to the inspection station outside the main office first.

Your Out-of-State License Plates

Bring them into the office with you.

Fees—Cash, Check, Money Order, Visa, MC

Call us with your VIN for an estimate of registration fees, which are partially based on vehicle value.

Driving Tests

All applicants take a vision test. Other tests will be waived if:

- You are age 25 or older and have no special restrictions.
- Your out-of-state license is valid and you are applying for the same class of license.
- You have no more than 2 moving violations and no suspensions, revocations, cancellations or denials in the past 4 years.

If you do not meet these requirements, you will have to take a written test and a skills test. License applications are checked with the national Problem Driver Pointer System. Special license, testing and endorsements are required to tow multiple trailers or trailers in excess of 10,000 pounds.

Motor Voter

Register to vote while applying for your drivers license.

Handicapped Parking

Nevada issues a placard which can be used on any vehicle or special license plates. The disabled resident must obtain a DMV application and have it signed by a licensed physician. Placards are also available for short-term disabilities.

Personalized/Specialty License Plates

Personalized plates are limited to 7 letters and/or numbers. Specialty plates are available for Nevada universities, veterans, Purple Heart recipients, Ex Prisoners of War, classic cars and a number of special groups and charitable causes.

Motorcycles & Mopeds

Motorcyclists are required to wear helmets and possess a Class M license. Nevada transfers most motorcycle endorsements. Mopeds 50cc or less, with less than 2 horsepower, do not have to be registered and you do not need a Class M license. However, you must have a valid Class C or higher license.

Boats

Water vessels are registered with the Nevada Division of Wildlife. Call 486-5127. Trailers are registered with DMV.

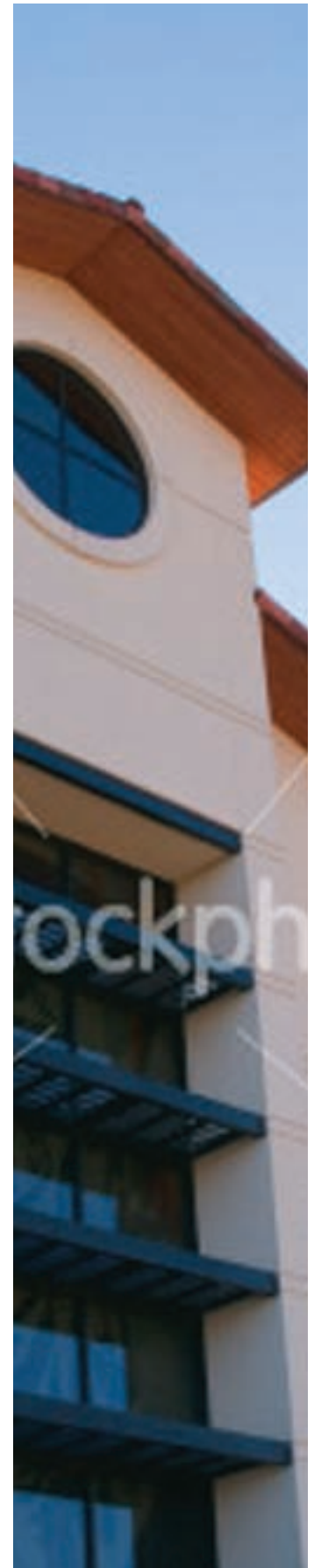

LAKE MEAD

Measuring 110-miles long, with a surface area of 274 square miles, the lake has more than 500-miles of shore for the thousands who, each day, boat, swim, water ski, hike and fish it. Access off Interstate 15 in Nevada; U.S. Highways 93 and 95 in Nevada and Arizona. Lake Mead National Recreation Area is located about 30 miles south of Las Vegas via U.S. Highway 93. The lake and surrounding area boasts five developed beaches and marinas with campgrounds and other services, including Overton Beach, Echo Bay, Callville Bay, Las Vegas Bay, Temple Bar and Boulder Beach. Boating of all kinds and personal water craft use are popular within Lake Mead NRA. Waterskiing is a favorite activity on the

broad expanses of open water, along with kayaking and canoeing. Of course, swimming is a major form of water recreation during summer months when lake temperatures warm into the 80-degree range. No lifeguards are present. Fishing enthusiasts can find some excellent sport fishing at Lake Mead, including varieties like largemouth bass, rainbow trout, striped bass, channel catfish, black crappie and bluegill. Only a few designated trails exist in the park, allowing those with experience to go out and explore on their own with the help of detailed maps and instructions to the most popular areas. The designated trails range from 0.5 to 1.25 miles. Short desert hikes lead to places you will never see from a boat or car. One such place is the area of colorful sandstone formations near Redstone Picnic Area along Northshore Road. Another is a canyon where Indian petroglyphs were carved in a rock wall hundreds of years ago. There are eight camping sites at Lake Mead - Boulder Beach, Hemenway, Las Vegas Bay, Katherine, Echo Bay, Callville Bay, Temple Bar and Cottonwood Cove. There are also six RV campgrounds with hookups. Paddlers can take two river trips, one runs from Hoover Dam south through Black Canyon on Lake Mohave; the other begins in upper Lake Mead and explores the western gorges of the Grand Canyon.

HOOVER DAM

Hoover Dam is 727 feet high, 1,244 feet long, 660 feet thick at the base, and 45 feet thick at the crest. It weighs 5,500,000 tons and contains 3,250,000 cubic yards of concrete. Located 30 miles south east of Las Vegas on State Highway 93. A 400 passenger parking garage is adjacent to the Visitor Center. Hoover Dam Visitor Center is open every day of the year except for Thanksgiving and Christmas from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m.

The tour through the dam and power plant is 1/2 mile and lasts for approximately 35 minutes. The tour is fully accessible and wheelchairs are available. You start the tour by descending 520 feet into the canyon wall and then walk through a tunnel into the

power plant. The tour is not recommended for those who suffer from claustrophobia or for those use pacemakers or defibrulators.

RED ROCK

The Red Rock Canyon National Conservation Area is located 20 miles west of Las Vegas. With in the boundaries of the 197,000-acre area is a 13-mile scenic drive, many miles of hiking trails, picnic areas and a visitors center with an exhibit room and bookstore.

Red Rock's most significant geological feature is the Keystone Thrust Fault. About 65 million years ago, two of the Earth's crustal plates collided with such force that part of on plate of grey limestone was thrust up and over the younger red sandstone. The fault extends from the Cottonwood Fault north to the vicinity of La Madre Mountain. The 13-mile scenic drive is a one-way road that also allows bicycle traffic. Sightseeing and hiking trails can be accessed from the parking areas on the side of the road. The scenic drive is open daily from 7 a.m. to 8 p.m. The entry fee is \$5 per carload, and you can also purchase a \$20 pass that will last you 12 months. Entrance is free for those who walk or ride their bicycles through the gate. Golden Age, Golden Access and Golden Eagle Passes are all valid at Red Rock. Bicycles are permitted only on designated roads and trails. The BLM advises cyclers to wear helmets, bright clothing, carry water, obey traffic laws and pay attention to drivers who may be distracted.



FAVORITE SPOTS

Bonnie Springs - Old Nevada

It is a privately owned enterprise featuring a reproduction of an 1880 western mining town with gunfights, hangings, melodramas, silent movies, saloons, restaurants and displays.

Spring Mountain State Park

Spring Mountain Ranch, a 520-acre area located at the base of Wilson Cliffs, offers historic tours, picnic sites and summer plays. The main house and historic grounds are open on select days. The picnic sites are open from 8 a.m. to dusk.

Wildlife

Numerous wildlife inhabit Red Rock Canyon. BLM officials ask visitors not to feed any of the wild animals and warn that all animals can be dangerous, especially the burros. Feeding burros encourages them to congregate on roadways where many have been killed or injured by vehicles.

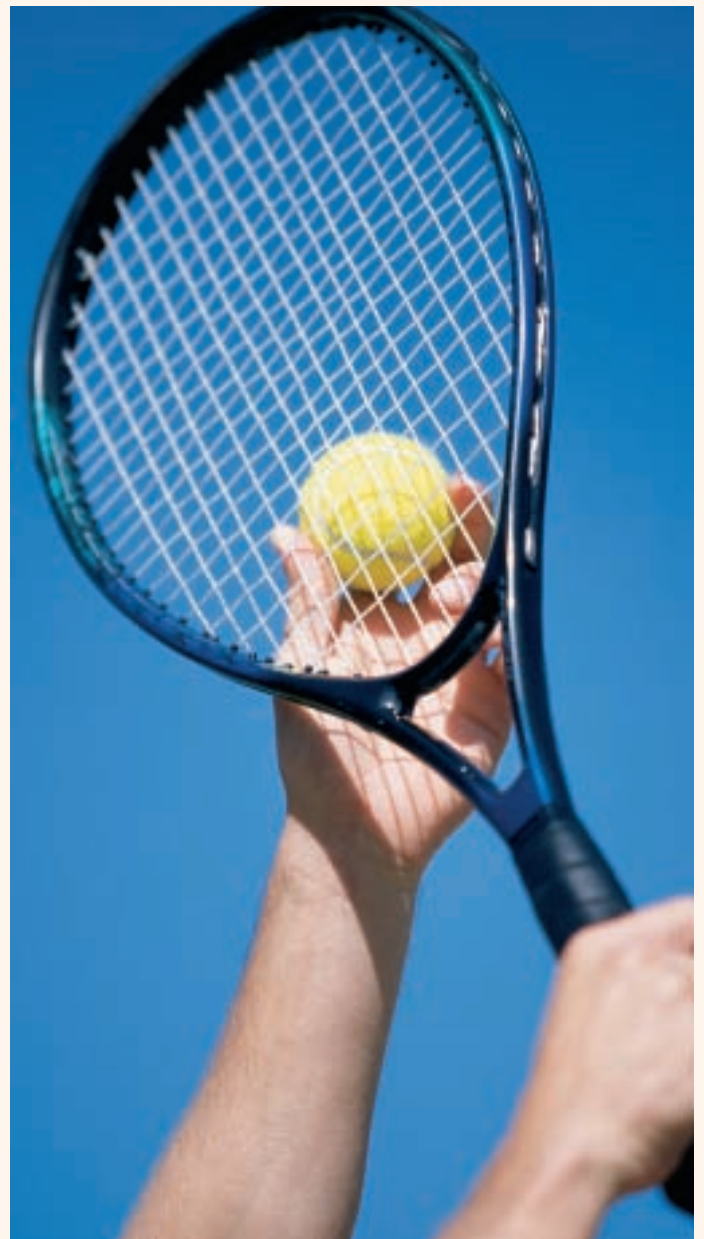

The Clark County School District is the 6th largest school district in the country. Last year the County added 10 new facilities to a total of 260 schools to accommodate the continuously growing number of students. With so many students, the Clark County School District offers a variety of programs in addition to its average curriculum. Special programs and services are available for the handicapped and retarded children, bilingual programs, classes for the academically challenged and advanced placement and honors programs.

MISSION STATEMENT

The mission statement of the Clark County School District is to ensure that all students will learn and demonstrate the knowledge, skills, attitude and ethics necessary to succeed as contributing member of society.

ACCOUNTABILITY REPORTS

As part of educational reform in Clark County schools, the District now provides Accountability Reports. Furnished each spring to parents and also available on the website www.ccsd.net, the report includes statistics about a school's performance as well as achievements, highlights, awards, goals and technology use.

AGE REQUIREMENTS

School Attendance is required for children 7 to 17 years of age mandated by Nevada State Law. Students about to enter 1st grade must have attended a state approved kindergarten program or take a developmental assessment test. A child must be 5 years old on or before Sept. 30th to attend kindergarten and 6 years old on or before Sept. 30th to attend 1st grade.

BUS SERVICES

Students who live more than 2 miles from zoned schools are eligible for bus transportation. Those who are eligible must fill out an application requesting the service. They are available throughout the School District. Bus times and route schedules can be obtained through your child's school. NOTE: Students with zone variances will not be bused. Parents will be responsible for the child's transportation to and from school.

MEALS AT SCHOOL

Every school gives students the opportunity to purchase breakfast and hot lunches. Elementary schools average \$.70 for breakfast and \$1.30 for lunches, while mid-level schools are \$.80 - \$1.00 for breakfast and \$1.95 for hot lunches. For students in K - 8th grade, applications for free or reduced price meals can be found at the school's office or cafeteria.

IMMUNIZATIONS

Nevada Law requires students to have these immunizations prior to the start of class.

4 DPT shots (one more if last dose was before 4th birthday)

3 Polio shots (one more if last dose was before 4th birthday)

2 MMR shots (one dose must be given before the 1st birthday the second given between kindergarten and 1st grade)

ENROLLMENT

In order to enroll students:

- Must have proof of immunizations before classes begin.
- Parents enrolling a child in a District School for the first time must have ID, child's social security number, and two forms of proof of address. Child ID's can be original birth certificate, baptismal certificate or passport. Copies are NOT accepted. Proof of address can be a recent utility bill, rent receipt, residence lease or sales contract. Telephone or cable bills and driver's licenses are NOT accepted as proof.
- All students who are transferring from another school district require transcripts or report cards from the previous school attended.

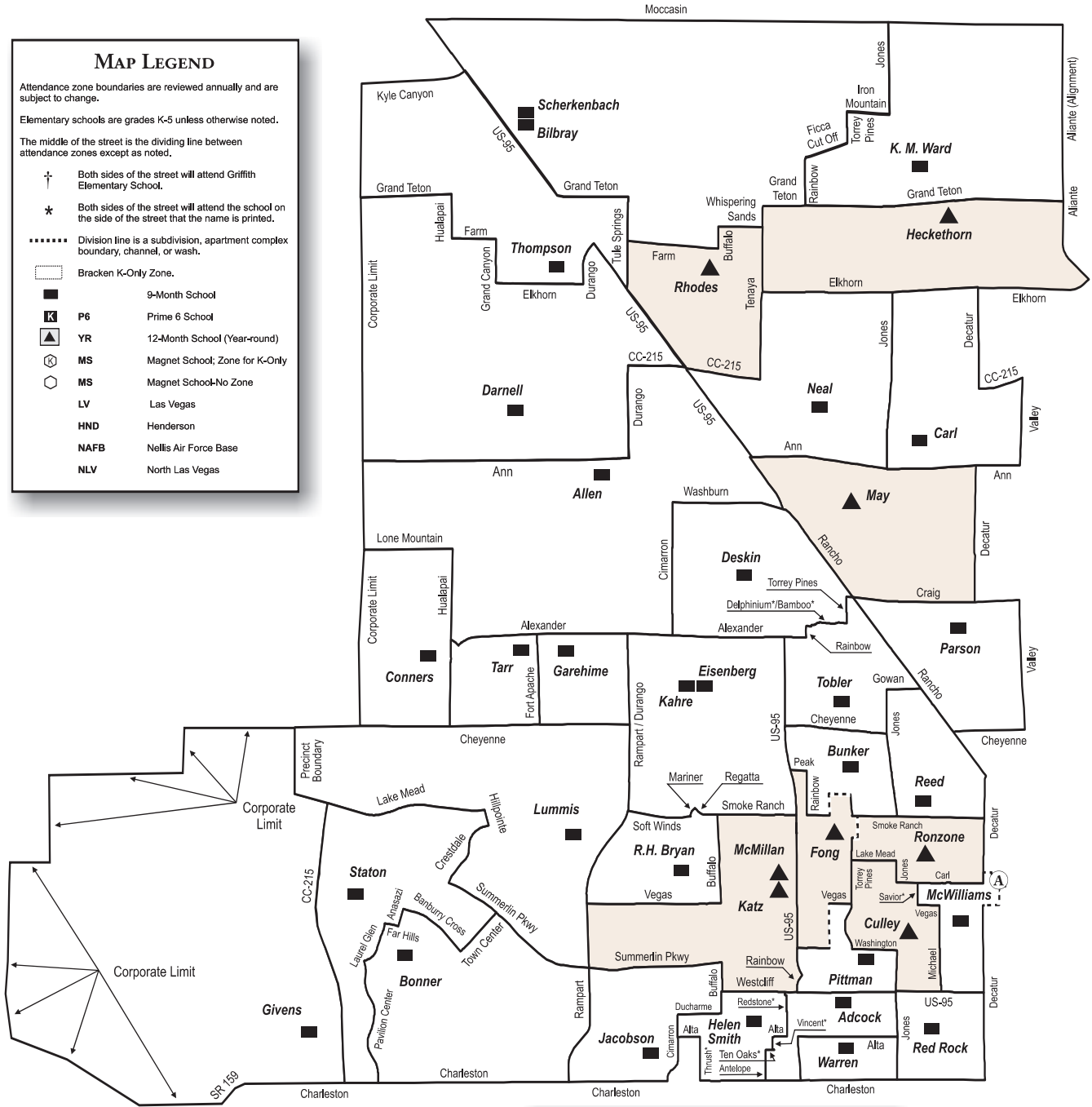

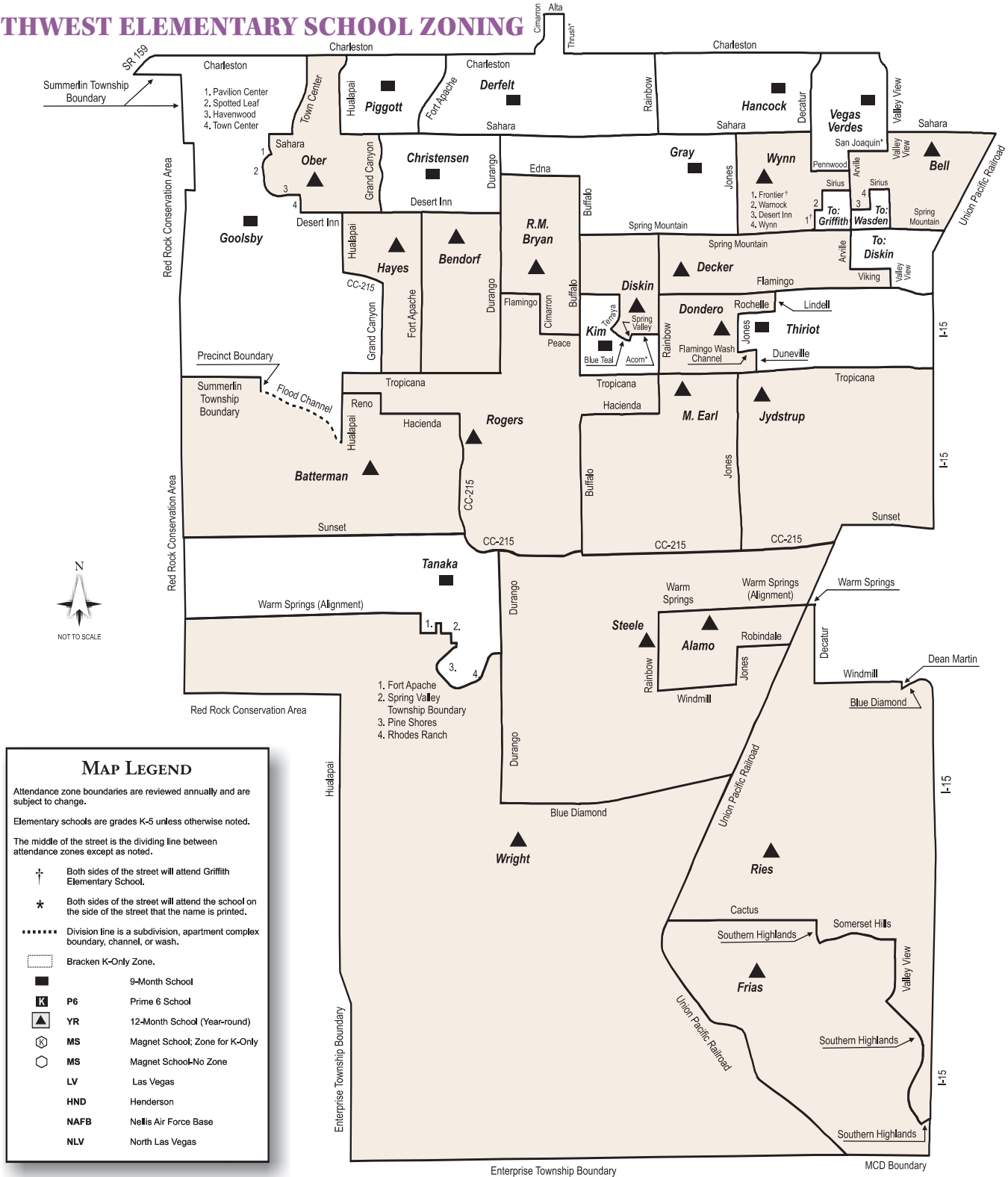

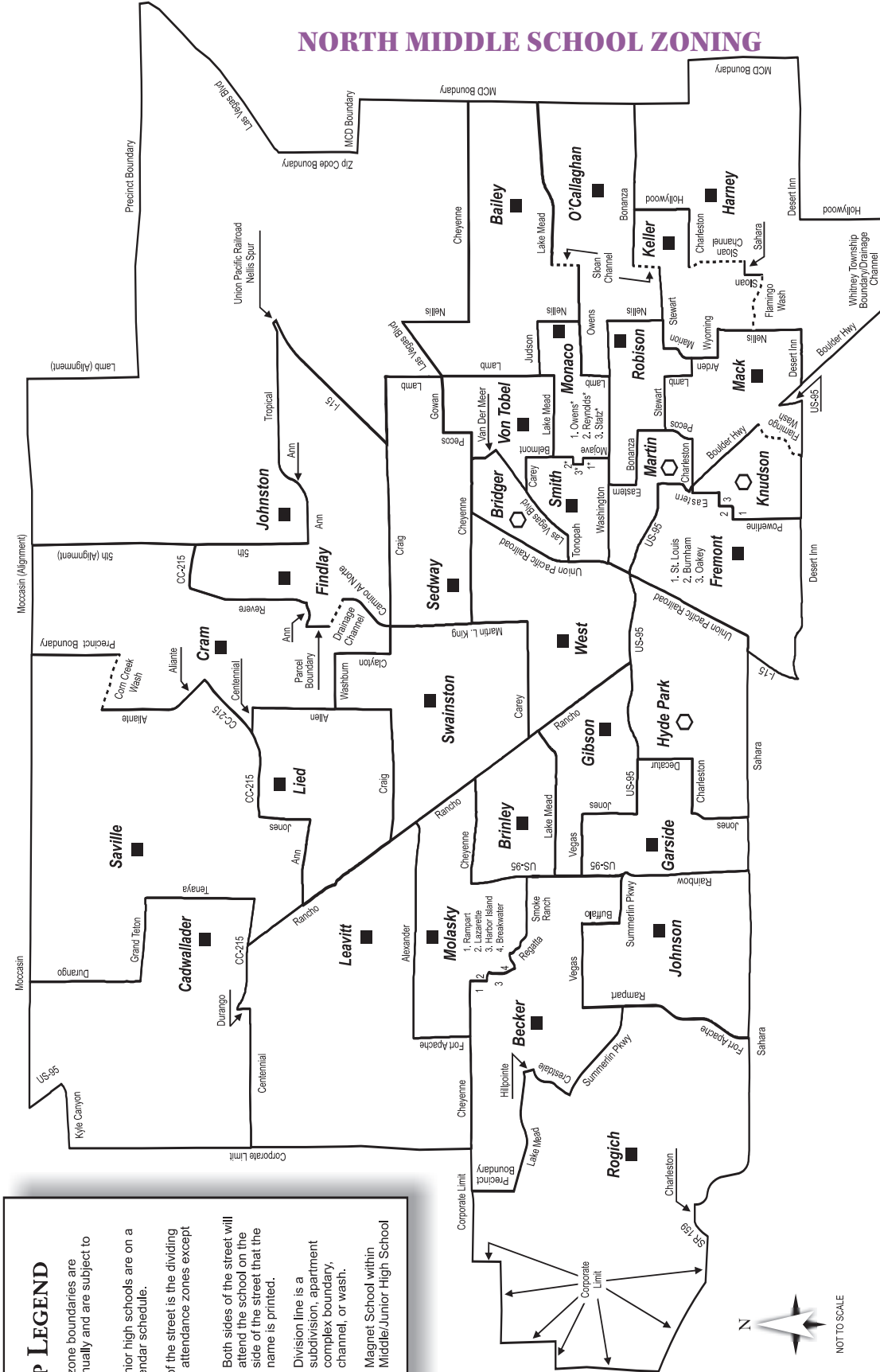

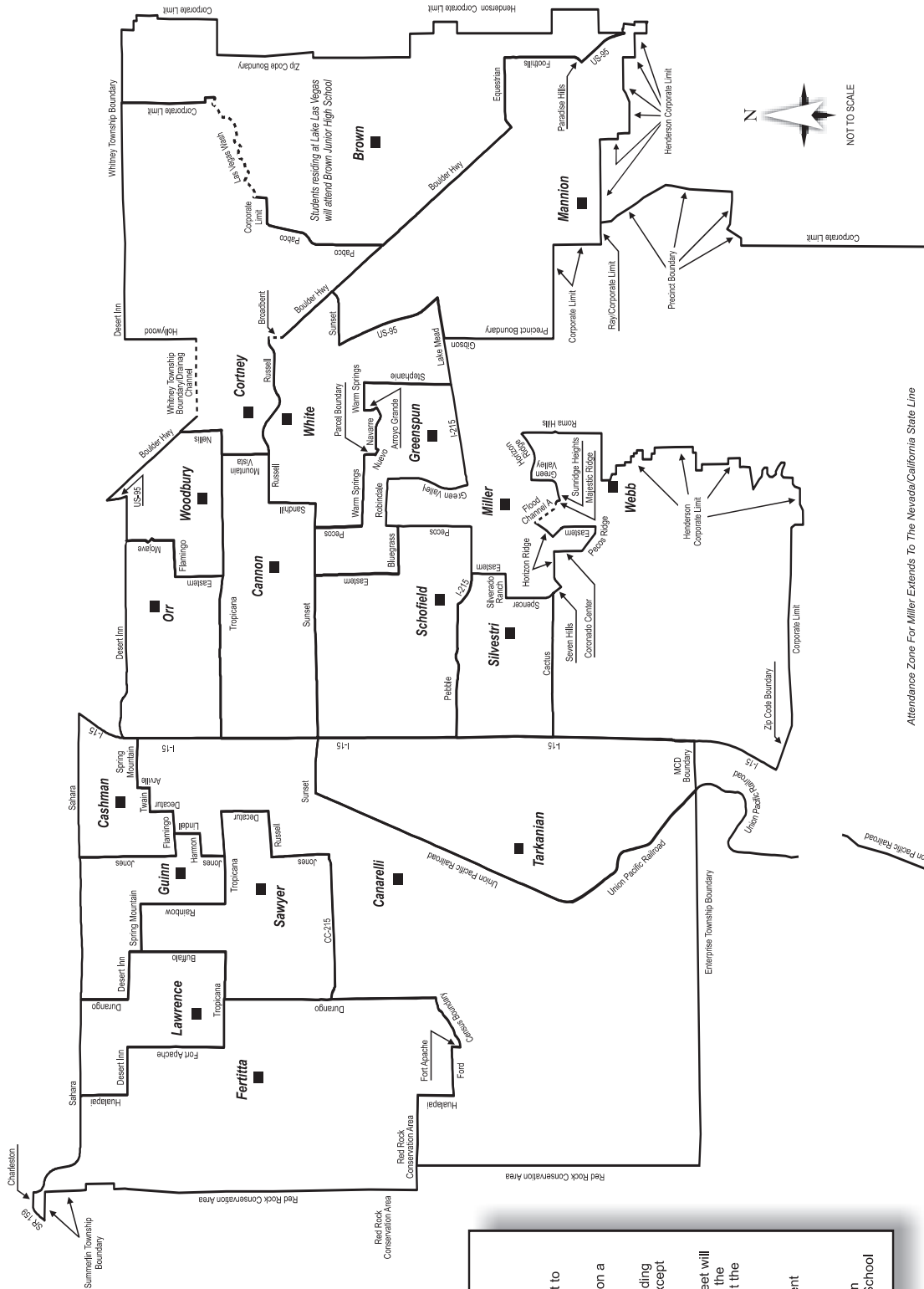
MIDDLE/JR. HIGH SCHOOL ATTENDANCE ZONES - NORTH (6TH - 8TH GRADE)

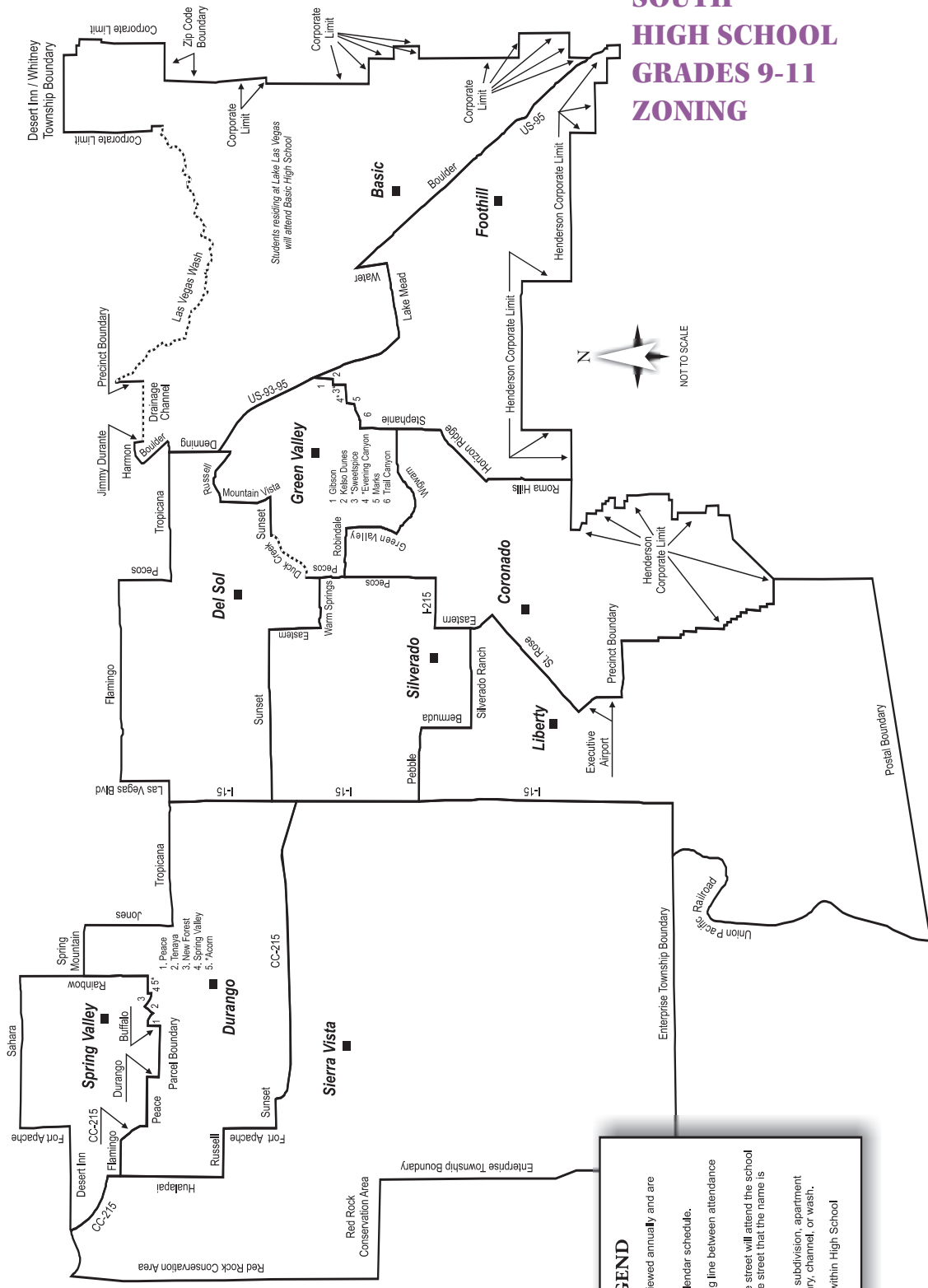
